1st Period Cut Claim Reminders

1st Period Cut Claims shall be on a round-by-round basis in inverse order of finish from the just completed regular season, due no later than 9 PM PDT October 8th. The Preliminary Draft Order will be used for Cut Claims. Participation is optional. Teams may pass at selecting. Once passing, teams are barred from placing a claim in a later round. Claims continue until either all players have been claimed or all teams pass. Teams may even claim a player they themselves cut, after all other teams pass on claiming him. I.E. To Claim a player you just Cut you are required to first Claim a player Cut by another OFL team.

(a) Teams Claiming a player cut in the 1st Cut Period pay \$100K to the team cutting that player.

(b) A team claiming a player cut while under contract in the 1st Cut Period must sign that player to any Standard Contract in March (See 1.C.II.2).

(c) A team claiming a player cut as a Free Agent in the 1st Cut Period obtains that player's Right of First Refusal only. The player still must go thru free agency.

ABANDONED FORMER MEDICINE QB STILL ALIVE!

It has been over two years since I abandoned Brett Favre on a drifting ice flow en route to Winnipeg. In February, 2006, I traded "the legend" to Lance's Winnipeg Vigilantes for linebacker, Matt Stewart and \$1.5 million. The deal made sense at the time – Favre was, everyone seemed to agree, washed up. He had one power season remaining in the OFL – a very good one based on his 2005 performance when he had passed over 500 times for 30 touchdowns and a QB rating of 92.4. He was, at the time of the trade, 36 years old and due for a big drop off in production the next season. He looked tired and ready to pack it in with Green Bay (pun intended).

So, with Winnipeg in need of a top flight QB for a title run, and my recently inherited Medicine Mad Hatters in need of cash to rebuild, the deal seemed reasonable. On the unreasonable side, I also saw the opportunity to dump a player who I respected for his accomplishments on the field, but who I had never warmed up to over the years of watching his Packers repeatedly block 49er playoff runs. The road to the Super Bowl for SF in the mid-90s twice came to a dead end against the Favre-led "Pack" and, yes, being a 49er fan, I harbored a grudge. I *wanted* to trade him of course, but I did not want to give him away for peanuts. Winnipeg's offer appeared fair for a guy with one productive OFL season left.

Two seasons later, not only is Brett Favre still playing in the league, but he looks poised to be reborn with the New York Jets. Everywhere you look for NFL news, there he is, dominating the headlines, the talk shows, and garnering the undivided attention of the football world as fans watch his saga unfold. We know that this is important football history happening in front of our eyes, and therefore worthy of the intense scrutiny. Heck, we are collectively obsessed with the Favre story because of its soap opera twists and turns and because we want to know how this could possibly be happening. Favre, *not* a Packer, come on!

I never really liked Brett Favre before this soap opera started, but I respected him in the way that a long time fan of the game has to respect a player of his accomplishments and longevity – grudgingly. Nobody can take away what Favre has meant to the game and to the Green Bay Packers. His place in the Football Hall of Fame, barring some kind of bizarre Pete Rose style scandal, is virtually assured. But this "un-retirement" episode has, for me, diminished that grudging respect I previously held for the man.

Behind the media hysteria and circus-like press conferences, I believe that something akin to a real human tragedy is taking place. Of course, I don't actually *know* what is happening behind the scenes any more than most people, but I *feel* that something is not right – that somehow the natural progression of things has been tampered with and that someone is going to pay for it.

While it seems that people can justify almost anything that happens in professional sports by reiterating the fact that "it's a business," that line just doesn't seem to hold up against the magnitude of this situation. Although it may be about business for the NFL at this stage, it appears that this is not merely about "business" for the people at the center of this drama.

Look at Favre himself. He doesn't really need the money. If it had been about money, would he not have taken the \$20 million offered by the Packers to stay retired? With Favre, it really is about *playing the game*. Like the "little kid" he is often portrayed to be, he wants to be out on the field having fun with his buddies. And like that same little kid, he would play all night if mom didn't call him in for dinner.

Well, at the end of last season mom finally called in Brett Favre for dinner and another kid got a chance to play – a kid who had waited patiently for his chance to get in the game. But before that kid could even throw a pass, out onto the playground charges Brett, leaving a half eaten plate of food on the table and the front door swinging behind him and yelling, "hey, I'm back! Give me the ball!"

The fact that Brett Favre is getting the impulse to play again, just as his internal body clock reminds him that it's late July and time to get ready to play, should come as no shock. Retirement can be difficult for anyone, in any profession, who has enjoyed a productive and happy career. The fact that he acted on that impulse, however, puts a spotlight on the "little kid" in Favre and shows that he really is, well, a kid. And like all little kids, it's all about "me."

Of course, as a grown "man-kid" Favre has a right to choose his own fate. If he still wants to play, "let him play," people say. The Packers should have done the "right thing" and released him if they did not want him, others say. There are countless opinions about what is "right" and "wrong" in a situation like this. Ultimately though, any choice any of us makes has to take into consideration the effect that choice will have on others.

Favre's decision to release his bombshell at that particular time and seek to return to the game after tearfully announcing his retirement last spring came well after Green Bay had made its plans to move forward without him. Favre's actions had the effect of a tactical and emotional ambush on the Packers and in the process disrupted the team he would profess to support. Did he expect to be welcomed back to the Packers with open arms? Did he expect Green Bay to shove Aaron Rodgers aside and give him back the starter's job? Did he expect them to bend to his will and release him to sign with rival Minnesota, a team only one quarterback away from contention, if they did not?

Who knows what was going on in his head, but it was a tired looking Brett Favre who finally addressed the media and faintly praised the New York Jets organization for welcoming him and his family to New York. Watching him, I got the sense that things had not turned out the way he wanted. And if I am right, and Brett Favre is less than excited about his new digs, then it will not be a happy time for him or the Jets this year in New York City.

Meanwhile, the ripple effect of Favre's less than graceful return to the spotlight is reaching out and rollicking other players and organizations. The under-appreciated Chad Pennington was unceremoniously and promptly dumped by the Jets in return for his nine years of loyal service to a team and community who during his tenure were always looking around for someone with a sexier style of play. In a sign that the Football Gods are not completely cruel, Pennington landed immediately in Miami and will be given the opportunity to exact a measure of revenge from the team that dropped him like a hot potato for a 38-year old kid.

In Green Bay, the entire organization, and particularly Aaron Rodgers, will be judged, fairly or unfairly, by both the measures of Brett Favre's achievements in New York and by their own performance. I get the feeling that Rodgers, like Steve Young, will have to win a Super Bowl to drive the monkey of his predecessor off his back. The pressure on Rodgers will be enormous and it is a good thing for the Packers that they have Brian Brohm waiting in the wings to take over down the road, at a greater distance from the 'Favre Saga,' if Rodgers buckles.

Meanwhile, media expectations are being consciously downgraded for Favre in New York. Many observers, including me, do not expect him to lead the Jets to the playoffs. Despite the intense Favre hype and references to his great last season with Packers, few seem ready to assertively endorse the 'Jet Favre' era in New York from a purely football point of view. However, should Favre rescue the Jets from mediocrity and lead them to the playoffs, his legend will be inflated to virtual Madden-like proportions and we will never hear the end of it. And I will be kicking myself for letting him go to Winnipeg in 2006 for Matt Stewart and \$1.5 million!
