No errors have been reported to date so we can cast these in stone at this stage.

Amendment Voting Results Inside

Two of the Five that passed have a meaningful impact on the remainder of your off-season activities as teams adjust their rosters. First off, you are no longer permitted to selectively deactivate players. Secondly, we now have a new claim period in March following a mandatory initial cut-down to 53 players. Players claimed in March may be retained with full 1st refusal rights, and offers teams a final opportunity to fill in roster slots from among the hundreds still available on the League Disk. Finally, a side effect from this new cut/claim period is it extends the Trade Period about 10 days, to March 20th. On the topic of rosters, once again:

Mandatory Roster Requirements Reminder

Teams must BEGIN the season with a minimum 3 RBs, 3 WRs, 1 TE or 1 H-Back, with an aggregate TOTAL for those positions of AT LEAST 9 players, (H-Back may count towards RB or TE but NOT both), 2 QBs, 8 OLs, 1 PK, 1 Punter, 6 DLs, 6 LBs and 7 DBs on their 53-man roster whom are Active and eligible to play in Game 1. (7 DBs are required for the "quarter defense" so you should carry 8 in case of injury.)

Thereafter, beginning Week 2, teams may opt to play a game with little or no depth at certain positions, with the only staffing requirement after Game 1 being **teams MUST start each game with a minimum 2 QBs & 1 Kicker (either PK or Punter) dressed/active (not injured).**

Participation is strictly Optional - If you're NOT participating then PLEASE send me an email with the subject line: "Your team name-No Bids".

Pool of available players are the hundreds on the latest league file listed as Free Agents High bidder (total value) gets player. No "draft rounds", simply bids on unrestricted free agents Contingent Bids are Acceptable - Minimum Bid Terms are any Standard OFL Contract. (See Page 15 in Constitution, Section 1.C.II.2.) Signing Bonus is optional.

Most Coaches bid 1 year @ 50 for virtually all, but a few worthy players always generate longer contracts (higher salary required), some may even warrant an optional signing bonus.

COMMISSIONER'S CORNER..... By Matt Farmer

1st & 10: I hope everyone enjoyed the draft. Overall things went very smooth. My only beef was the time I took to take the draft (I guess I have to complain about something). Other than the time, it did go quite well. I hope everyone is happy with their selections.

2nd Down: I was also pleased by the participation in the draft. Everyone with the exception of Kutztown (who had no draft choices) will receive the participation bonus. It is always good to see such league wide participation.

3rd Down: With the draft behind us, it is now time to prepare for the supplemental draft and focus on assuring you have your minimum opening day roster requirements. Remember once the season starts you can make further trades and waiver moves and the opening day roster restrictions no longer apply. In making out your roster, I would look closely to assure you have sufficient rushing attempts, receptions and pass attempts. The number you need will depend upon your preferred play calling and to a degree, how good your overall units are point wise. If you are heavy on the rush for example, I would look to have at least 400 rush attempts, 400 pass attempts and 250 receptions. Again remember that you can pick up additional guys later in the season if you find yourself running out of attempts, pass attempts or receptions.

Timeout: From my view, there do appear to be a number of strong teams again this year. This should turn out to be another very competitive season. We have been fortunate to have very competitive seasons for at least about the last three years running. This should be the fourth year running in that regard. While it is still early, and it is just a guess on my part, I would not be surprised to see a Las Vegas/Winnipeg Super Bowl. No pressure Lance but you have to win this thing one of these years!

4th Down: Good luck to all as we have the season about to begin. If there are any new coaches out there that have any questions, please feel free to drop me a line or one of the many other helpful coaches in the league.

IMPORTANT REMINDER ABOUT CUT COSTS.....
As you consider your Supplemental Draft participation & Trade opportunities

Cut Costs of a player cut in the 3rd Cut Period (in March) shall be as follows:

"Remaining Salary" = Yearly Salary x Years remaining on Contract:

- (a) Players still under Contract (except Superstars) at 100% remaining salary.
- (b) Superstars at 150% remaining salary;
- (c) 1st & 2nd Period Cut Claims & Free Agents retained (who received no Bid) at \$50K each.
- (d) Any player selected in the recent Rookie Draft is Cut at no cost.

Appreciate your Supplemental Selections will fall into category A above- players under contract, should you decide in March you no longer want them.

Some teams would rather trade away players likely to be released to save on cut costs. Over the coming 6 weeks there may be opportunities to acquire fillers, 1-yr quick fixes, and depth at good value. Value to you acquiring and to your trade partner who reduces his potential tab at buying out contracts.

Player contracts should be taken into account at all times when considering trades. What makes perfect sense to one team can be a deal breaker to another strictly on the basis of the contract and its impact on the acquiring team's financial plans.

All cut costs & 2009 salaries are deducted from your Team Treasury at the end of March. You're required to have sufficient funds at that time to cover these expenses.

2009 Fresno Fuel Forecast
Getting Ready For An A Beating**

The Fresno Fuel just completed a great three year run in the OFL from 2006 to 2008:

- 16-0 regular season record in 2006
- Three straight conference championship games
- Back to back Super Bowl appearances (2007-2008)
- Back to back Super Bowl wins (2007-2008)

To be honest, I never thought I would have this kind of success in the OFL. The league is chalk full of some of the brightest football minds I know and the game day coaching is the toughest around to face. Throw into the mix our complex money management set up and you have, in my opinion, the most complex and challenging football simulation around. With all of the foregoing, winning the championship is quite rewarding. Winning the championship back to back is even more the accomplishment to be proud of.

Of course, one of the beauties of our league is that you cannot just draft good players, make good trades, and coast off of that forever. The money aspect throws a big wrench into the whole equation. It is that wrench that has put a screeching halt to the Fuel competing this year.

My team simply got old and too expensive. It did not help that Tiki Barber retired (a key component to my two championships and probably involved in the best trade I ever made). My offensive line became decimated and I was hit very hard in free agency. With all those strikes against the Fuel, I had no choice but to rebuild.

The start of a rebuild is probably the most difficult time and this will be no different for the Fuel. The team lacks any marquee skill players and has a non-existent offensive line. As of the writing of this article, the team has a single wide receiver and no tight end (supplemental draft will have to fill some holes). Throw into the mix a tough first place schedule and things will get quite ugly. An 0-16 record, I hate to say, is not out of the question.

Fortunately, I do feel the Fuel had a fairly good draft. The draft, from my view, presented a number of great prospects on the offensive and defensive line and the Fuel picked up a good number of them. Building strong lines, especially on the offensive side, are top priorities to the Fuel.

From here on out, the focus will be on continuing to rid the roster of older players and reducing payroll down to a more manageable level. The draft will obviously be of high importance for the next few years. On the flip side, I will probably not be a major player in free agency for a couple of years. This should also have the added benefit of increasing the team's coffers for when the time comes to pursue those extra pieces in free agency.

It will not be an easy road and game day play this year will be brutal. Hopefully in three years the team will be back on track to compete.

TURNOVERS

I am not talking about the normal types in games, this is bigger in the coaching ranks (NFL). There was alot of them this last couple of weeks, and I am glad that this insn't in the (OFL).

Now still dealing with turnovers, roster moves, trades. Which team is in great situation for this season, how did they do it. Was it with trades, drafts picks or getting lucky with Koch Kuddo numbering system. I for one am overwhelmed with the stats I am looking at to get the right picks in the draft, and looking into 2 years of stats for each player and where they are on the starting role on the team. Then look at are they in a division that passes alot or runs the ball, of course the defense with against the run gets more INT and the LB get more tackles against run teams.

This is just my thoughts, of course and being in this league not very long. I might be off base on how I am looking at it, but maybe in 2 years I can see how my draft did this year and next will be.

Ok, dealing with turnovers with players, does this go into the Koch effect with Offensive line players stats, because I was terrible on the line with alot of penalties in key situation. These to me almost go into the turnover stats area for picking players or am I getting it wrong! To be able to compete at the highest level in this league, learning play calling isn't enough.

Now that I have everyone confused in my heading !

Looking at stats for the better teams, the ones with less turnovers on offense and less penalties do better, but the big one is the owner has been here awhile and knows how to put a good team together by making offers and taking good ones. I can say I will be here awhile as long as I can becoming a worth while opponent that other teams will hate to play and love to trade with.

The OFL draft is just around the corner. Here are some of the names you can expect to hear. It is not always easy to get into the head of other GM's, but I will attempt to give rationale for who I think the top 10 picks will be while providing a couple other players who would be good fits for the teams based on need and overall talent. For picks 11 – 20 I will list the team and list my best projection (guess) followed by two alternatives.

1. Winnipeg Vigilantes – RB Adrian Peterson. Peterson will team with RB Fred Taylor to give the Vigilantes a formidable 1-2 punch.
2. New Jersey Patriots – ILB Patrick Willis. Willis can anchor the middle for years to come. Joe Thomas and Darrelle Revis would also be very good fits for New Jersey.
3. Round Rock Crusaders – T Joe Thomas. Thomas can be relied upon to protect the blind side of the Crusader QB. Darrelle Revis and Jon Beason may also be on the Crusader wish list.
4. Scottsdale Rancheros – LB Jon Beason. Beason would run sideline to sideline in a flash for years to come for the Rancheros. Darrelle Revis and LaRon Landry will be on the radar.
5. Antelope Mud Fish – CB Darrelle Revis. Revis looks like the real deal and will provide the Mud Fish with a compliment to Terrence Newman. Calvin Johnson and LaRon Landry would be good options as well.
6. New York Cobras – WR Calvin Johnson. WR of his skill do not come along that often and NY has huge need at this position. Marshawn Lynch and LaRon Landry would be suitable as well.
7. Medicine Mad Hatters – RB Marshawn Lynch. Lynch would add some punch to the Medicine backfield. WR Dwayne Bowe and S LaRon Landry will also be considered.
8. Florida Dragons – S LaRon Landry. He is a good place to start in rebuilding the secondary. T Levi Brown or G Ben Grubbs would be good options as the OL needs to be rebuilt.
9. Prairie Wildfire – DB Michael Griffin. Griffin is a ball-hawking safety that would patrol the Wildfire backfield. T Levi Brown or G Ben Grubbs would also be solid options.
10. Sacramento Scorpions – WR Dwayne Bowe. Would combine with Wes Welker to make a solid duo. T Levi Brown or OLB LaMarr Woodley would also be good options.

A NEW APPROACH TO RENOVATE THE DRAFT.....
It might offer more opportunities for the weaker franchises

With Rookie Draft & Amendment voting completed decided it was prime time to abandon the concept of revising the draft order, and explore an alternative means to renovate the draft.

The sooner we help weaker franchises move from 1, 2, 3 & 4 win seasons to becoming genuinely competitive the better off we all are and the more fun it is for everyone. Here's an idea that possibly offers them opportunity to utilize the draft more efficiently and rebuild more quickly than is available to them now.

Split the current 8-round all-inclusive format into two 4-round draft pools
 4-round Rookie & 4-round Free Agent Drafts

Initial 4-round draft pool would be restricted exclusively to the actual NFL players selected in the corresponding NFL Rookie Draft. Example: For our 2009 OFL Draft just completed on Jan 24th that would have been the players selected in the [2007 NFL Rookie Draft](#). To keep things very simple OFL teams would be permitted to select ANY player that was actually drafted by the NFL that year, regardless if he appears on the current OFL season disk. (This negates the need for us to painstakingly cull the NFL Draftees that missed their NFL rookie year. If an OFL coach wants to draft them in this Phase, let 'em!)

The second 4-round draft would be comprised identical as it is now- ALL remaining available players on the OFL season disk that are not on an OFL roster. (Again this simplifies- with those players that missed entire season ineligible for this Phase- same as now.)

Do the advantages outweigh the negatives?

Advantages:

The lowest seeded teams would enjoy first chance at both the best of the true NFL rookie class, as well as the veteran journeymen (and true NFL rookies leftover from 1st phase). One has to hope this can only offer more opportunity for the lowest seeded teams to rebuild more quickly. That in turn offers opportunity for OFL to be more competitively balanced overall.

I can't quantify it, but I tend to believe splitting the draft into two 4-round events will lead to a shorter time frame to prepare for & complete, because:

First 4 rounds (Rookie Draft) we'd be selecting 80 true NFL rookies that should come off the board quite rapidly. Working from Draft Lists & EDLs just half the size required now & comprised of a much smaller player pool leads me to believe that.

Second 4 rounds (Free Agent Draft), conducted at a later date, teams would have enjoyed literally a couple of weeks to focus on the remainder player pool (all remaining players on the league disk) for the 4 remaining rounds.

Negatives:

It splits what we now complete in single 3-½ hour afternoon, to requiring participation on two (or more) different dates.

As much as I'd prefer to conduct the second 4-rounds also in a chat room, if that's not the majority view, here's a thought.... We continue to conduct Phase 1 live in a chat room and the 4 rounds of Phase 2 simply by email at the rate of 1 round each day, or better yet 1 round every other day over the course of a week.

Likely terminates forever the incentive for groups of coaches to gather at central locations on Draft Day like we used to enjoy. Interest & participation in those has greatly waned in recent years. (It's nearly impossible for me with my current job, unfortunately.)

Summary:

We'd retain the Live Chat Room camaraderie enjoyed for 4 rounds in the Rookie Draft where the most "action" takes place, within a shorter & more compatible time frame that should place less strain on everyone. We then have a couple of weeks to digest the results, re-evaluate our needs, before tackling the second 4-rounds which is suitable to an email format. (Though my personal preference is for a 2nd live chat.)

Most importantly, the lowest seeded teams will enjoy the first opportunities at both the true NFL rookies and most coveted journeymen, hopefully providing them greater chances of successfully and more quickly rebuilding their franchises.

Housekeeping:

If proposed next December and passed, it would become effective starting in March 2010, changing the format of the 2011 OFL Draft.

For clarity, trades involving either draft would simply specify "Rookie" or "FA" [Free Agent]:

Las Vegas trades their 2nd round Rookie & 3rd round FA draft picks
to Fresno for DT Kevin Williams.

In developing this potential amendment, I did consider essentially retaining our current 8-round live chat room format, and simply restricting the draft pool in rounds 1 thru 4 to the true NFL rookies. That I believe would be confusing to some, particularly when evaluating trade proposals. Splitting the 8 rounds into two distinct 4-round player pools clarifies & simplifies, especially for a new coach.

Your constructive comments on this concept are welcomed & encouraged.

2008 AMENDMENTS

Brief Description Below – For Full Details Review December Newsletter

1. Extend Commissioner Matt Farmer's term for one more year. PASSED
2. Teams no longer permitted to selectively de-activate players until they've either clinched their Division or AFTER Week 14, which ever occurs first. (An exception will be the League Statistician on directive from Commissioner may de-activate injured and/or uncarded players if the Game Engine does not recognize their correct status.) PASSED
3. \$150K Bonus per week of Play only earned for games played H2H. Using a sub/interim coach permitted & qualifies for earning Bonus. (Owner-less teams & games vs. them are exempt from requiring H2H.) PASSED
4. New coaches may exercise up to 5 Restructuring Moves on the roster & draft picks they inherit, which they can apply in any combination of the following 3 ways. FAILED
 - (a) May cut any inherited player (including Superstars) at no cost.
 - (b) Claim a compensatory draft pick at the end of ANY round in which they don't own a pick.
 - (c) May buy out any inherited player contract (including Superstars) for 100% remaining contract value and re-sign him to a standard OFL contract.
5. New mandatory initial cut-down to 53 players about 1st week of March, followed by 10 day cut/claim period on 1st come-1st served basis for all remaining free agents. Players claimed are signed to any standard OFL contract (1-5 years) with teams having full 1st refusal rights. PASSED

6. Revamp first 12 drafting slots of Rookie Draft to: Non-playoff team with the best Win percentage drafts 1st down thru the non-playoff team with the lowest drafting 12th. FAILED
7. Teams declaring (directly or via their instructions) they're passing in any round of Live Bidding must automatically pass in subsequent rounds. PASSED
8. Add a third (3rd) round of Live Bidding. FAILED
9. Require 1st & 2nd Period Claims be assigned a standard OFL contract (1-5 years) after they're awarded, except for players who must enter free agency. FAILED

Retain a copy for your records. All Bids/Bonuses must be in \$50K increments.

Minimum Bid Terms are any Standard OFL Contract. (See 1.C.II.2.) Signing Bonus is optional.

You may Bid on as few or as many free agents as your available funds permit. Be sure you check your treasury & projected salaries to ensure you can afford all your winning Bids. You do not fill out any accounting form, just note at the bottom the maximum amount you can afford. Determine the maximum amount your yearly salaries & optional signing bonuses can possibly total. In the example below that amount is equal to: \$1,400 With the following 7 Players having the highest possible 1st year cost. (Player #1 @ \$350 + #2 @ \$150 + #3 @ \$100 + #4B or #4D @ \$100 + #5D & #5E @ \$350 + #6A @ \$350)

Review these examples. Note how to Prioritize (by numbering) those players you want regardless, (QB, RB & LB in this example).
